#### **Green Signals Ahead**

**IMPORTANT!** Next month on Saturday March 17, 2018 we will have our first Membership meeting of the New Year. This is an important meeting as the Regular Membership will be electing three new members to the Board of Directors as well as three members for the officer positions; President, Secretary, and Treasurer. The membership will also have an opportunity to review and vote on the new budget for fiscal year 2018 that begins on April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018. I encourage all Regular Members to come out and vote. Note: All Associate Members are also welcome to attend all PLS Membership Meetings, but only Regular Members are allowed to vote. This meeting will also give all members, both Regular and Associate the opportunity to learn about open and new projects that PLS will be working on as we enter the New Year. And yes...The above paragraph is a repeat of my message that appeared in the January – February 2017 Gazette, but this message is important enough to repeat. I also encourage all members to read through this issue of the Gazette as it includes all the details about those running for office and a detailed budget that you, the Regular Members, will have a chance to review, ask questions and cast your vote.

Speaking of the budget, last season the Gauge 1 Team undertook a complete rebuild of the entire gauge one track system. The Gauge one track had been in operation for twenty years and weather and time had taken its toll on the entire track system. The track work was completed in time for the fall meet and the only work that re-

mains is the closing of the tunnel using the same technique used to build much of the New York City Subway system. The process called dig and cover. The digging of the gauge one tunnel along with the track laying is complete, now what's left is the covering part. The Gauge 1 Team is to be congratulated for a job well done and staying on schedule and on budget. This rebuild was one of our most costly maintenance projects with budget of \$9000.00. I mention this because in 2018 we are facing another large expense and that will be the painting of our caboose. You will note that we have budgeted for this work. I also can tell you that the BOD is still looking for the most cost effective method of getting the work completed and any input from the membership would also be appreciated.

We are currently working with a paint company that has experience with supplying painting for metal structures, including cabooses. They will provide recommendations for the type of paint and preparation that is required to get us the longest lasting paint job and the best possible cost.

As you know winter has been holding on at PLS. The photo below taken on 2/4/18 shows just how mean this winter has been. Even when the snow has left much of the railroad our track seems to be the last to defrost.

I look forward to seeing you at the March meeting.

Each year the Frederick Living community hosts a train show which in addition to their club's layouts also features guest scale railroad clubs that set up temporary layouts for the event. This event serves as a fundraiser for the community. I attended their event this past October and met several of their members. Two of them accepted my invitation to attend the last PLS Run Day of the 2017 season. They hope to bring additional members during the 2018 season.

Did you know that there's another train club in the vicinity of Pennsylvania Live Steamers? It is at the Frederick Living retirement community. The members of this train club maintain HO and O Gauge layouts and are currently developing an N scale layout. They also have additional train memorabilia, publications and accessories. The club has approximately 60 members many of which, but not all, are members of the Frederick Living community. However, all members have some affiliation with Frederick Living. The club is located in Magnolia Hall which is on the 3rd floor of the main building on their campus in Frederick, PA. All of the track layout was donated about 8 years ago. A crane was required to deliver the O gauge platform to the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor club area.

The layouts in their current forms have been tailored to reflect scenes of the surrounding area including representations of Grandview Hospital, Frederick Toy Store, and even a replica of the Frederick Living retirement community itself. Many of



these items are hand painted and hand crafted. Some additional one of a kind attractions include a ski mountain which includes two mechanical lifts, a fair

James T. Connelly 1942 - 2018

PLS Regular Member James T. (Jim) Connelly passed away on January 24, 2018 at age 75. He is survived by Sharon, his loving wife of 38 years, his children Sean and Erin, and two grandchildren. Jim was born in Philadelphia on May 4, 1942. In 1965 he founded his business, J.T. Connelly Woodworker, in which he was active until his health began to fail.

Jim had other interests before joining PLS. He loved sailing and he and Sharon spent much time on the forty-foot sailboat they had owned, even sailing to Bermuda. Jim was also a Corvette lover who raced them in his earlier days.

Jim first came to PLS in 2008 and soon became a Regular Member. He quickly began applying his talents as a woodworker *par excellence* to tackle projects at PLS. Jim had a drive for perfection and wouldn't let a project go until he was satisfied that it met his expectations. His wife Sharon also became a Regular Member and they worked together on many projects. Jim was a train lover for most of his life and had trains running all over his house, mostly in "G" Gauge (LGB.) That made PLS the perfect place for him to expand his railroad horizons, so he purchased various equipment in 7-1/4 inch gauge that he and Sharon operated on the PLS track. Not long after joining PLS, Jim attended the auction at the annual *Cabin Fever Expo* where he purchased a twenty-foot steam-powered launch. He owned it for a few years and steamed it on Lake Nockamixon.

Unfortunately, as his health began to fail a few years ago, Jim was unable to attend events and participate at PLS. He has been and will continue to be missed by the PLS members who knew him. Our sincerest condolences go to his wife Sharon, his children and their families.
