Paul Quirk, Sr.

1930-2022

Thirty-five year PLS member Paul Quirk passed away on Wednesday April 7, 2022 at 92 years old. Along with his brother Harry, Paul was a driving force in the promotion of gauge one live steam at PLS and across the mid-Atlantic area. Paul and Harry built a portable gauge one railroad which they carted to Rough and Tumble Engineers, the Blue Mountain Gas and Steam Association and PLS. The presence of the Quirk portable track encouraged the PLS board to approve the building of a gauge one permanent track in 1995. Work was started after the 1996 50th anniversary celebration and completed for the 1997 fall meet.

Early on there were very few American outline gauge one live steam locomotives available and Paul became adept at kitbashing foreign outline locomotives into American outline. Until very recently Paul could be found running the Aster French 141R that he had kit-bashed into a Reading Wooten firebox Mikado. Paul could be relied upon to help anyone with a recalcitrant locomotive. He always had a large assortment of tools with him and would say that if he didn't have a particular tool then you didn't really need it. Paul was always encouraging us to run locos every chance we could. His idea was that more practice improves your skill; and besides it is fun. Paul's enthusiastic running was legendary among the gauge one fraternity.

I met Paul and Harry at the 1995 Small Scale Steam-up in Diamondhead Mississippi. For the next decade or so, Paul, Harry, Murray Wilson, and myself made the annual January trek to Diamondhead. Many memorable hours were spent discussing trains both full size and model. The long drives to distant steam ups can be rather tedious, but not if you were traveling with Paul and Harry. The stories, the antics, Paul on the CB to truck drivers, the drive down to Diamondhead and back was almost too short.

One of the most important contributions Paul made to PLS was the skill and expertise he brought to construction projects as a master carpenter. If not doing the work himself, he often provided skillful direction to others to move the project forward.

Paul will be sorely missed by many at PLS.


