

Rahns Station Roof Cap Replacement

Replacement of the lower roof cap of Rahns Station was recently completed. The station's original roof cap was constructed using finger-jointed pine boards. While pine was an economical material choice, it is a very poor weather-resistant material and probably should not have been used for this application. Despite the fact that it was primed and painted, it weathered extremely poorly to the point where it was literally disintegrating (see the "before" photo).

President Pat Murphy and Secretary Mark Cahill discussed how best to replace the roof cap. The decision was made to use cedar, a more expensive but a superior weather-resistant wood.

Secretary Cahill volunteered to donate the material and time required to complete the replacement.

To minimize construction time on the very steep roof and maximize safety, Secretary Cahill elected to construct five eight-foot sections of roof cap on the ground using glue and exterior grade fasteners. He primed and painted the sections, custom cut them to length and then installed them on the roof (see the "after" photos)

Due to the slight curvature of the station roof, there were gaps between the butt joints of adjacent sections. To improve the overall appearance and more importantly to prevent rain water from penetrating through these gaps, the gaps were covered with two-inch wide Venetian blind slats in matched paint color and fastened using stainless steel screws.

Hopefully, the replacement roof cap will last a very long time. Also, if/when replacement of the station's wooden roof shingles becomes necessary, it should be fairly easy to remove and reinstall the new roof cap to facilitate the re-shingling of the roof.



A little over a year ago I decided I was going to build another 1.5 scale Diesel. This time it would be larger than my first build, a two axle GE "critter". But it had to be something I could build as accurately as possible, be something different, and be a locomotive that still exists. So after some consideration I decided on a Baldwin DS-4-4-750. Not only have I always been a Baldwin fan but there is a DS-4-4-750 at the Allentown and Auburn Railroad. So on January 2, 2022, with the help of Mike Bast, I started measuring the former Warner Sand And Gravel #14. Over the next month I returned a few times for additional measurements. I then did the scale conversions (one foot =1.5 inches) for the physical drawings with my brother putting the drawings into CAD for the parts I needed Laser cut. I also acquired a set of powered trucks from L&B trains that need some minor work and assembly. I'm currently working on the doors for the long hood, cab doors, roof, radiator tank and other detail parts for the body and frame. Then onto paint (Warner #14 in green) and then finally the wiring. If all goes well I'll have it ready to run for the first 2023 run day at PLS.
