Green Signals Ahead

pdate to my last article that appeared in the July - August Gazette. That article discussed several acts of vandalism that took place on PLS property and the fact that several individuals were caught on a PLS security camera that was installed by Pete Brown. The time stamped video and several enlarged still pictures were sent to the State Police.

The good news is the three youths we caught on camera were identified by the Pennsylvania State Troopers and have admitted to the break-in of Buildings 6 and 9. State Trooper Kassel gave us an opportunity to meet with the three individuals involved in the in the vandalism and a chance to tell them about the long history of PLS and the members that work very hard to keep our property in good order. We expressed our extreme disappointed in the damage that they did to our property, property that did not belong to them. We also received an apology for the damage they caused.

This is not the end for these offenders that will now have to participate in the Montgomery County Youth Aid Program, a unique program for first time offenders created by the District Attorney's Office. The program offers and alternative to court prosecution for juveniles alleged to have committed certain minor offenses. The program is designed to help juveniles avoid future contact with the criminal justice system through the involvement of local community volunteers and keeps the juvenile from carrying a criminal record.

As part of this program, the juvenile must admit his/her involvement in the incident and appear before a panel of carefully selected and trained community volunteers. The panel members supervise juveniles in an effort to hold them accountable for their actions and facilitate a constructive contribution to the community. Juveniles are required to fulfill certain assigned conditions aimed at teaching community responsibility within a specified time in order in order to complete the program successfully. This may include community service of compensation to PLS, the victim for any out of pocket loss caused by the crime. If the offender fulfills all of the obligations ordered by the panel, the juvenile will avoid a criminal record. Failure to complete the conditions will cause the case to be sent to court for prosecution.

It is a shame that three young men, one eighth grader and two tenth graders decided to trespass on our property and force the doors open on two of our buildings. The program outlined above seems like a sound path to second chance. It is likely that we will see these boys on our property again as the Fall leaves will soon be falling and a few extra hands to help clean up the mess that mother nature will soon be making is always welcome. We also have a few other areas that could use clean up.

We are taking a number of actions to improve security at PLS. Pete Brown is working on expanding our camera system to give us more coverage of the property, this will require expanding the reach of our wireless system to reach across to the north side of our property. We will post signs that will let anyone entering PLS property that we are using video surveillance, those

signs are being prepared by Larry Moss. We will improve the locking system on both Building 6 and 9 making it more difficult to force the doors open. We have also taken several other actions to better protect the assets of Building 1 our clubhouse. I will not write about those actions in this message, it is better if it is communicated in a face to face at a membership meeting or possibly in a BLAST.

As mentioned above, Pete Brown has been working to improve our video surveillance, I should warn you that this also includes both video and audio and the microphones are very sensitive so you might want to watch your language, not just because it may be recorded, but because it is the courteous thing to do and we do not want to offend anyone. And don't forget we often have children on the property. In case you didn't figure it out the cameras run 24 hours a day seven days a week. If you're on the property your also on camera (video)!

The scheduled running season is coming to an end with the last run in October, just about the time that you will be reading this message. Don't forget that just because the running season is coming to an end that doesn't mean the work season is over, especially Fall cleanup. We always have something to work on at PLS!


